Wildlife Sanctuary is one of only a few places that can accept a wild animal? Many come from the staff at the [Appalachian Animal Hospital](#) - Ellijay. This superior animal health care provider for dogs, cats, birds and reptiles is one of the very few veterinarians in Georgia that will also take in an injured wild animal, help it through its medical crisis, and then place it at the Sanctuary for rehabilitation and release.

Of course, emergency life-saving work and rehabilitation means we need your donation right now. Without it, we cannot provide the rehab care needed by injured or orphaned animals. Your donations go to buy special formula and food to nurse these creatures to health until their happy day of wild release. Projects at the Sanctuary



The Wildlife Sanctuary is looking to upgrade all of its animal habitats, buildings, roads, pathways, signage and grounds. We need lots of supplies to do this.

You can help by e-mailing us if you have contacts who can provide lumber, marine plywood, gravel, sheetrock, interior woring, electrical boxes, sockets, wall plates, marine grade paint (for outdoor cages), road grading equipment, boulders, pond liners, working pond pumps, planting soil, flowers or bulbs, bags of cement or concrete, aluminum bleacher seating, 4"x4" square tubing - you name it. We'll also be putting a list of items we need online. Donate what you can, or forward the list to someone you know who might just have (and be willing to donate) something for a sanctuary project. We are also looking for a 30'x60' two-story metal building to assemble on our 40'x80' concrete pad.
